Description

The Advocates team serves as an in-person focal point at PMINYC-sponsored events, such as Chapter and Career Development Network (CDN) meetings. As an Advocate, you are serve as the client-facing front office for our members and guests in a variety of ways, including:

- Answer member inquiries
- Provide personal engagement to address member concerns
- Publicize Chapter events
- Evangelize for PMI and the Chapter
- Encourage members to volunteer for the Chapter, including sign-up
- Resource direction in many dimensions
- Resource for other teams, depending upon the needs of those teams.
